MTP: THE GREATEST TREASURY OF EXPOSITORY SERMONS

In 1952 I found myself on a remote island off the north coast of Scotland. While there I learned that the personal library of a Christian sea-captain, who had died some time before, was for sale. I went to the house where the books were available. As I looked them over, I saw an almost complete set of the original edition of *The Metropolitan Tabernacle Pulpit*. I inquired the price, but, alas! even though only a few pounds, it was too much for the pocketbook of a poor theological student. I had to relinquish the opportunity to add those magnificent volumes to my library.

Since that time I have been able to purchase several volumes of *The Metropolitan Tabernacle Pulpit*, but never have I had the opportunity of getting a complete set. An abridged edition, of course, is available, but I have never liked to buy books condensed by others, especially if the original is
